But even in the South of France, duty calls.


"I'm getting my inspiration for my new collection for Grandin Road," David said. "What better place to go than St. Tropez?"



Known for his love of color, David brought in two bright Harrison Chairs (\$899 each) from his Grandin Road collection.




There's even more seating in the entryway thanks to two Dumont Chairs (\$349, originally \$399).




The dining area features David's "Do I Have Something in My Teeth" Artwork (\$229) on the wall.

David's Harry Bench (\$899) has pride of place by the window.






The living space is bookended by two white Beckett Lamps (\$259). David completed his sofa vignette with the addition of Reversible Throw Pillows (\$79 each).
